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




- 1. The step survey on non-communicable diseases carried out in 2019 reported the following findings which is a serious public health concern for the country:

  - There is an increase in the proportion of overweight.
  - ➤ 86.4% of respondents have insufficient fruits and vegetable intake.

Based on the above findings, answer the following questions.


- a) Write down the possible consequences for the public and country if quick intervention is not implemented.


4. There are 5 different types of human teeth as shown in the diagram bellow. Name the teeth (1-5) and explain the function of each tooth.
