



The Royal Civil Service Commission in collaboration with Ministry of Health and Jigme Dorji Wangchuck National Referral Hospital is organizing a three-day virtual training on **“Advance Patient Care”** for Clinical Nurses from 22-24 November, 2021 in Thimphu. The programme is supported by the Temasek Foundation (TF), Singapore for technical expertise from SingHealth Alice Lee Institute of Nursing and Singapore Polytechnic International (SPI), Singapore.

It is attended by 56 Clinical Nurses from Jigme Dorji Wangchuck National Referral Hospital, District Hospitals and Faculty of Nursing and Public Health under KGUMSB. Her Excellency Health Minister, Honorable Dasho Dechen Wangmo graced the opening session of the program.

At the end of this three-day training, participants are expected to acquire skills and knowledges relating to advance patient care; perform airway management and incubation; perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation; performs burn dressing; perform priming of intra-arterial line and treat post-partum hemorrhage with heightened degree of knowledge, skills and professionalism. Participants will also continue to apply the new skills and knowledge and attend follow-up coaching by the SingHealth facilitators to enhance their practices.

The training is identified as one of the critical mandatory trainings required under the Competency-based Framework of the Clinical Nurses developed jointly by the JDWNRH, MoH and RCSC. Further, it is part of the skills building program of the RCSC to professionalize the Civil Service.
